Article 1 point (1) Act No. 6 of 2011 (Immigration Act)

“Immigration shall be defined as all means related to the mobility of people entering into or exit from the Territory of Indonesia and its control in order to protect and uphold the state sovereignty”

Immigration shall be defined as :

1. All means related to the **mobility of people entering into or exit from** the Territory of Indonesia;
2. Its (immigration) **control** in order to protect and uphold the **state sovereignty**.

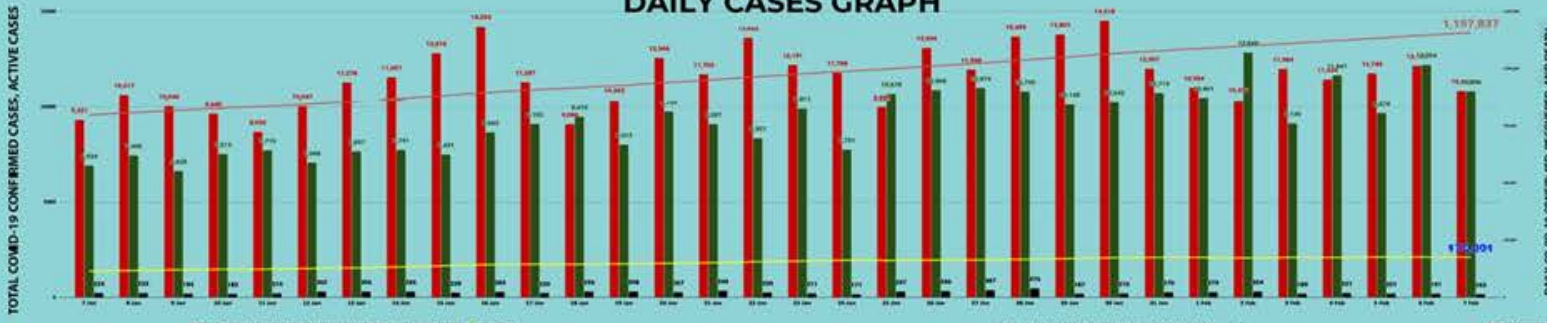

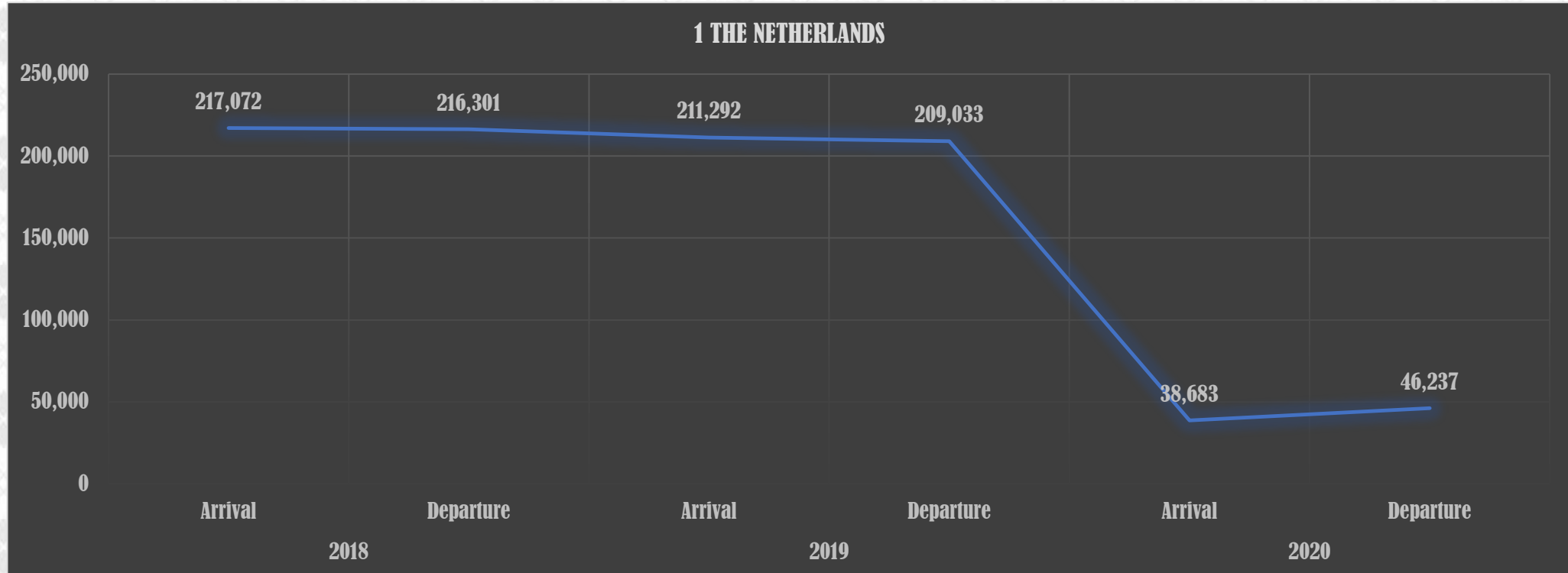

REGULATION OF MINISTER OF LAW AND HUMAN RIGHTS
NUMBER 26 OF 2020
ON
VISA AND STAY PERMIT IN THE NEW NORMAL

CHAPTER I
GENERAL PROVISION

Article 1


In this Ministerial Regulation,

1. Visa of the Republic of Indonesia, hereinafter referred to as Visa means a written statement given by an authorized officer at Indonesia Missions Abroad or other places determined by the Government of the Republic of Indonesia containing an approval for a Foreign National to travel into the Indonesian Territory and a prerequisite for granting a Stay Permit.
2. Electronic Visa, hereinafter referred to as e-Visa means a Visa granted in an electronic form by an authorized officer, containing an approval for a Foreign National to travel into the Indonesian Territory and a prerequisite for granting a Stay Permit.
3. Foreign National means a person who is a non-Indonesian citizen.
4. Stay Permit means a permit granted to a Foreign National by an Immigration Officer or Indonesian Foreign Service officer to reside in the Indonesian Territory.
5. Sponsor means an individual or a Corporation responsible for the residency and activities of a Foreign National while residing in the Indonesian Territory.
6. Re-entry Permit means a written permit granted by an Immigration Officer to a Foreign National holding a temporary Stay Permit and a Permanent Stay Permit to re-enter the Indonesian Territory.
7. Minister means the minister administering government affairs in law and human rights.

Article 2

- (1) Foreign nationals holding a legal and valid Visa and/or Stay Permit will be allowed to enter the Indonesian Territory through designated Immigration Border Controls after undergoing the health protocol procedure.
- (2) The health protocol as referred to in section (1) is determined by the ministry or agency mitigating the Covid-19 outbreak.

Indonesia has proposed the establishment of a travel corridor between ASEAN member states to increase the region's connectivity and facilitate economic recovery after the COVID-19 pandemic.

At the 36th ASEAN Summit plenary session on Friday, President Joko "Jokowi" Widodo said enabling good connectivity within the region was key to its economic recovery.

RE-OPENING THE INDONESIAN BORDER

Safe Travel Corridor Arrangement Between The Republic of Indonesia And The United Arab Emirates

I. Principles

- a. The close partnership between the Republic of Indonesia and the United Arab Emirates is a solid foundation for strengthening the two countries' cooperation in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic.
- b. In view of recent developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Republic of Indonesia and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) view the urgent need to strengthen bilateral cooperation during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- c. In this regard, the two Parties agree to establish a bilateral, temporary Travel Corridor Arrangement to facilitate the easing of travel for business, employment, economic and diplomatic purposes as well as diplomatic and official purposes.
- d. The Travel Corridor Arrangement shall in no way undermine public health and quarantine protocols in respective countries.

Travel Corridor Arrangement Between The Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of Korea

I. Principles

- a. The Special Strategic Partnership between the Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of Korea provides a solid foundation for further strengthening bilateral cooperation in the fight against COVID-19 pandemic.
- b. In view of recent developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of Korea view positively efforts to promote mutually beneficial economic cooperation.
- c. In this regard, the two Governments (hereinafter the Parties) agree to establish a bilateral, temporary Travel Corridor Arrangement to facilitate the easing of travel for business, employment, economic and diplomatic purposes.
- d. The Travel Corridor Arrangement shall in no way undermine public health and quarantine protocols in respective countries.
- e. Based on developments related to the COVID-19 situation in both countries, the two Parties shall conduct regular consultations with relevant stakeholders to assess the operational status of the Arrangement, improve the effectiveness of the Arrangement, and expand the scope of its application, including for tourism purposes.

II. Subjects

Nationals of the Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of Korea, traveling to and from both countries for business, employment, economic as well as diplomatic and official purposes.

Fast Lane/Travel Corridor Arrangement Between The Republic of Indonesia and the People's Republic of China

I. Principles

- a. The Comprehensive Strategic Partnership between the Republic of Indonesia and the People's Republic of China provides a solid foundation for further strengthening bilateral cooperation in the fight against COVID-19 pandemic.
- b. In view of recent developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Republic of Indonesia and the People's Republic of China view positively efforts to promote mutually beneficial economic cooperation.
- c. In this regard, the two Governments (hereinafter the Parties) agree to establish a temporary Fast Lane/Travel Corridor Arrangement to facilitate the easing of travel for business, employment, economic and official purposes.
- d. The Arrangement shall in no way undermine public health and quarantine protocols in respective countries.
- e. The two Parties shall conduct necessary consultations with relevant stakeholders to assess the operational status of the Arrangement, improve the effectiveness of the Arrangement, and expand the scope of its application, including for tourism purposes.
- f. The two countries will also explore possibilities to further enhance the effectiveness of the Arrangement, including for tourism purposes.

NON-PAPER ON THE RECIPROCAL GREEN LANE / TRAVEL CORRIDOR ARRANGEMENT FOR ESSENTIAL TRAVEL BETWEEN SINGAPORE AND INDONESIA

(I) Applicants

The eligible applicants for the Reciprocal Green Lane / Travel Corridor Arrangement ("RGL")¹ are (a) Indonesian citizens as well as Singapore citizens and permanent residents travelling from Indonesia to Singapore; and (b) Singapore residents travelling from Singapore to Indonesia for business and other purposes.

(II) Locations

2 The RGL will be launched between (a) Singapore and Batam Center Ferry Terminal and (b) Soekarno-Hatta International Airport (Singapore) and Soekarno-Hatta International Airport (Tangerang).

3 Travellers from Indonesia are allowed to travel to Singapore, via the Batam Center Ferry Terminal and Soekarno-Hatta International Airport. Travellers from Singapore are allowed to travel to Indonesia, after arrival at Soekarno-Hatta International Airport.

(III) Application

4 For applicants travelling from Indonesia to Singapore, the applicant must apply for a Singapore government agency in Singapore (i.e. the sponsor) to issue a Singapore Pass application on behalf of the applicant under the Singapore Pass. If the Singapore Pass is approved, an approval letter will be issued. Policies in place prior to COVID-19 will apply for Indonesia. The RGL.



ASEAN DECLARATION ON AN ASEAN TRAVEL CORRIDOR ARRANGEMENT FRAMEWORK

WE, the Heads of State/Government of the Member States of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), namely Brunei Darussalam, the Kingdom of Cambodia, the Republic of Indonesia, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malaysia, the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, the Republic of the Philippines, the Republic of Singapore, the Kingdom of Thailand, and the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam, on the occasion of the 37th ASEAN Summit:

RECALLING the Declaration of the Special ASEAN Summit on Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) of 14 April 2020 that highlighted our commitment to further strengthen public health cooperation measures to contain the pandemic and protect the people;

FURTHER RECALLING the ASEAN Leaders' Vision Statement on A Cohesive and Responsive ASEAN: Rising Above Challenges and Sustaining Growth (Ha Noi, 26 June 2020) that demonstrated our commitment to maintain necessary interconnectedness in the region by facilitating to the extent possible the essential movement of people, including business travellers, while safeguarding public health in line with our efforts to combat the pandemic;

NOTING the progress of the development of the ASEAN Comprehensive Recovery Framework and its Implementation Plan, while emphasising the importance of its timely implementation;

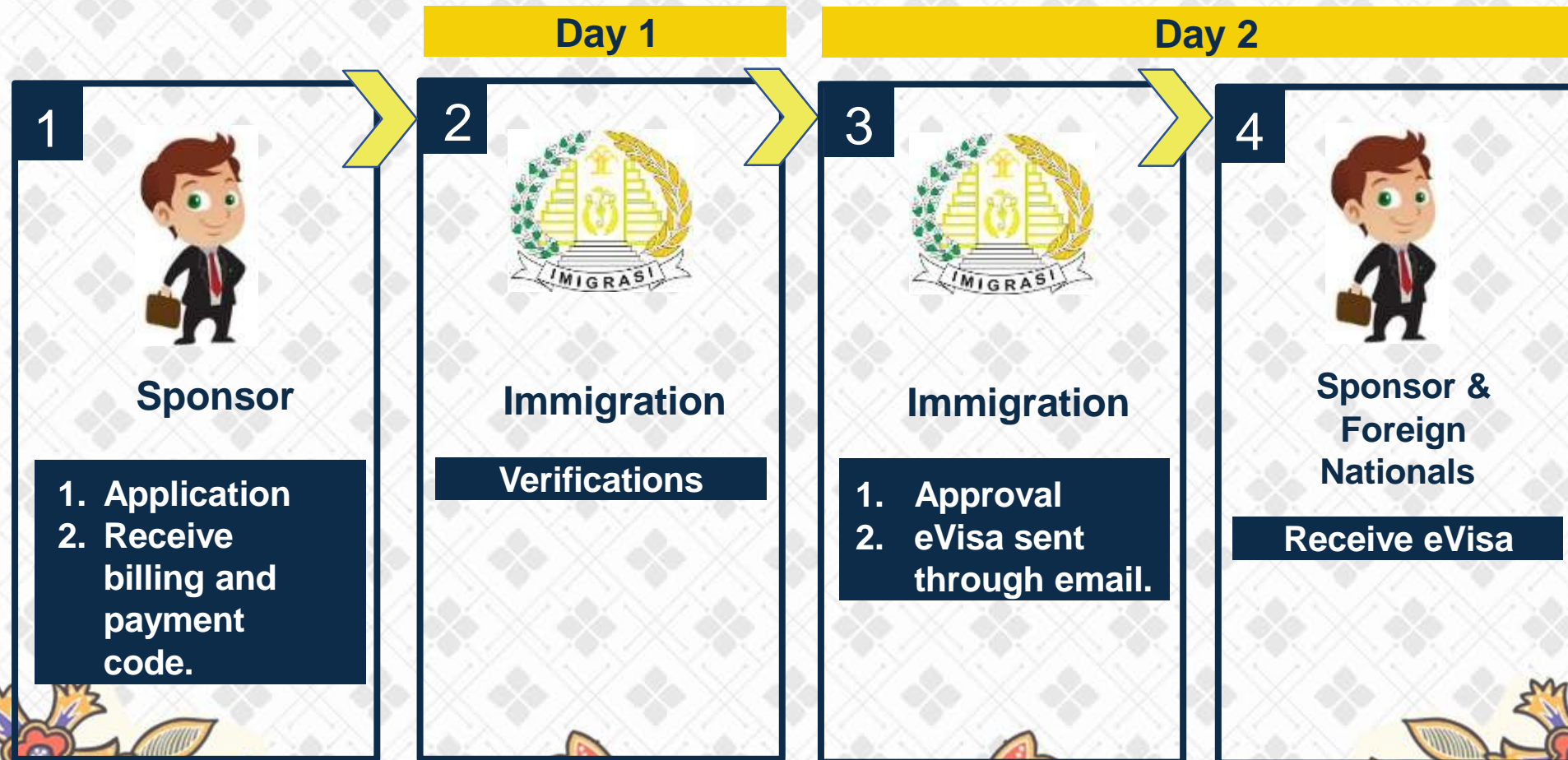

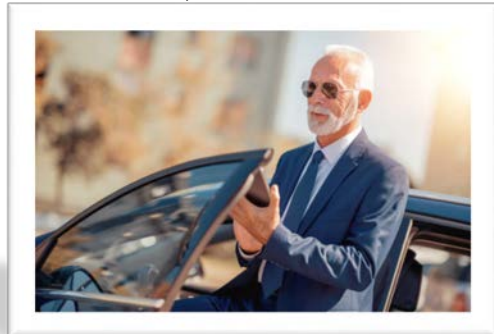
